Dementia 2018: Dementia Capable Communities Report

- 139 attendants
 - o 73% completed activity evaluation form
 - o 99 participants from Nevada
- All respondents said the program was excellent or good
- 99% would recommend
- Almost all respondents said objectives were met
- 78% said they were likely or very likely to change their practices

Community Assessment Report – Dr. Peter Reed, Sanford Center for Aging

- Estimated 29,660 w/ dementia in Clark County
- A majority of community know someone living with dementia (77%)
- Transportation services and business/retail have worse attitudes towards individuals living with dementia
- 27/57 would recommend CC for relative with dementia
- Community identified lack of dementia education, transportation services, and clinical services
